School Holiday

The "Prefectural Citizen's Day School Holiday" is **a designated school holiday intended for experiential learning activities at home and in the community, as well as other educational activities.**

The purpose of this holiday is to provide an opportunity for students and their families to participate in hands-on learning experiences related to the region's nature, history, traditions, culture, and industries. Through these activities, students can deepen their understanding and appreciation of Aichi while fostering a sense of pride as citizens of the prefecture.

We encourage parents and guardians to take this opportunity to enjoy a relaxing autumn day with their families.



◆During the "Aichi Week" period from November 21 to 27, one day is designated as a school holiday for public schools (including kindergartens, elementary schools, junior high schools, high schools, and special needs schools).

Q & A



Q When and why was the "School Holiday" established?

A As a legacy of the 150th anniversary of Aichi Prefecture, November 27 was designated as "Aichi Citizen's Day" in 2023. The "School Holiday" was created to provide an opportunity for children and families to spend time together.

Q Which schools are closed on the "School Holiday"?

A Public schools in Aichi Prefecture, including kindergartens, elementary schools, junior high schools, high schools, and special needs schools, will be closed. For private kindergartens and schools, please check with each institution individually.

Q Is the "School Holiday" date unified across the prefecture?

A Since school events and schedules vary, each school or municipality sets its own designated holiday.

Q What if parents cannot take time off on the "School Holiday"?

A The prefectural government will request cooperation from municipalities to ensure alternative childcare options, such as opening after-school (jido-club) programs.

Q What events are planned during "Aichi Week"?

A Various events introducing the charms of Aichi, including talk shows and family-friendly activities, are planned. For details, please visit the "Aichi Citizen's Day & Aichi Week" special website, which is scheduled to be renewed in the summer of 2026.

Q Will the "School Holiday" also be implemented in nursery schools?

A Nursery schools will remain open, as they are welfare facilities designed to provide childcare for children whose parents are working or otherwise unable to care for them during the day.
