## **Philosophy**

With the aim of realizing a multicultural society through the cooperation of all people, including Japanese and foreign residents, the city government, and city residents, we have established "Creating Together: Anjo, a Multicultural City Where Everyone Can Live with Peace of Mind" as the philosophy of the 3rd Plan



About the Formulation of the Plan

The City formulated the 1st Plan in 2014 and the 2nd Plan in 2019, and has been promoting various initiatives. As the national government is expanding the acceptance of foreign workers, the number of foreign residents in Anjo, a city with thriving industries such as manufacturing, is expected to continue to increase. In order to further promote multicultural coexistence measures, we have formulated the 3rd Plan, covering the five-year period from 2025 to 2029.

# Community Development by Diverse Actors

We will promote multicultural coexistence throughout the entire city of Anjo through the collaboration of diverse actors, such as between the city government and city residents, and among city residents themselves.

We will provide seamless support for consultations from foreign residents, which are becoming increasingly diverse and complex, and create an environment where foreign residents can live safely and with peace of mind.

- Promoting career development and understanding of the education system for students requiring Japanese language instruction and their guardians

We will work on effective information provision and communication to foreign residents, enhancement of Japanese language learning opportunities, and promotion of communication among city residents that transcends nationality.




# Number and Percentage of Foreign Residents (Aichi Prefecture and National Comparison)

As of the end of September 2024, the foreign population of Anjo City is 8,523, accounting for 4.5% of the city's population. The percentage of the foreign population is higher than the national average and Aichi Prefecture.
